### THE CHALLENGES

If there is one thing Americans can all agree on, it is that the deep divisions we face are tearing at the fabric of our communities and institutions. A range of organizations – businesses, non-profits, community organizations, and government agencies - are faced with challenges navigating the resulting issues and the new approaches they require. Higher education institutions face particular challenges:

- Fostering inclusive academic environments consistent with long-held values at a time when "us vs. them" is such a prevalent way of seeing the world.
- Addressing issues of free speech and academic freedom.
- Managing the expectations of increasingly diverse groups of employees, students, the local community, and other stakeholders.
- Providing transparency and building buy-in around potentially divisive policy positions.
- · Convening public meetings or town halls that result in increased understanding and problemsolving rather than devolving into uncivil debate.


## Curriculum
